

Note. The principal part of the men on page nos 1 & 2, up to No 63, and some others were mostly discharged about June 15<sup>th</sup> 1836, by Capt Patton & Genl Rusk. The remainder were discharged by myself, & the Col of the Regiment. They served out their time in the army, and in the fall of 1836, I discharged the last man, and returned home to my family. About the 5<sup>th</sup> of August, Capt Patton, ordered by the Genl, took ten men of the Company and proceeded to Columbia on Brazos, to take charge of President Santa Anna, which he did.
